



Tuberculosis Testing

As part of the admission process at The Plaza at Punchbowl and Department of Health regulations, all residents must comply with TB testing prior to admission.

Compliance includes one of the following scenarios.

1. A completed two-step Mantoux tuberculin skin test:
The initial skin (first step) must be negative, followed by a negative second step administered 1 to 3 weeks later. Dates given, dates read, results, and signature must be indicated on the documentation.
2. A completed one-step Mantoux tuberculin skin test that has been completed within the last twelve months AND documentation of a previous negative two-step.
3. A positive skin test followed by a standard chest x-ray:
 - a) Documentation of the positive skin test; and
 - b) Documentation of a negative chest x-ray.
(See below for acceptable wording on all chest x-rays)
4. For Emergency Admissions only:
 - a) Documentation of a negative chest x-ray.
(See below for acceptable wording on all chest x-rays)

NOTE: Documentation for all chest x-rays must:

- a) Be issued by the “State of Hawaii Department of Health”; or
- b) The x-ray must indicate that the reason for exam was to rule out TB; or
- c) The results may contain one of the following statements along with a signature and date of a radiologist or physician:
 - “negative chest”
 - “essentially negative chest”
 - “no disease found”
 - “no tuberculosis found”
